Erika Jenkins was introduced and provided a brief overview of what/who SPE is, priority areas and how WHY is focused on marijuana and alcohol, the SPE 5-year Strategic Plan now being updated with WHY and other SPE workgroup's help. Erika then expanded on how she and Isaac provide support to WHY's work on the plan. Erika confirmed that the first ask is to present on challenges, success, and elaborated on the tool to help us define those challenges and successes. The Strategic Plan update timeline was reviewed Mary, Kasey, and Martha will be working to put the 2018 WHY Action Plan into a more workable format. This will be emailed out to members with the SPE worksheet for member review prior to the March meeting, where it will be discussed. Ad hoc teams may need to be formed in order to get various portions of the new Action Plan formulated.

	Legislative Updates	10:20	Megan and Mary	Megan shared about HB1668 which sought to regulate hemp-derived impairing cannabinoids, how it was delayed, and "dead" and how it was revived. Megan gave the update on the latest her work with Rep. Kloba. The difference between the former bill has a licensee fee added. This allowed the bill to be revived. Title has been narrowed in the attempt to limit amendments.

6.	Are licensees complying with alcohol delivery regulations?	10:XX	Mary	April is Alcohol Awareness Month. As a prep for this AAN is looking to revive the assessment tool introduced to WHY last year by Julia Dilley.

				Mary reviewed current data on compliance checks, trends, delivery requirements, and problems with delivery compliance checks. The assessment tool would make compliance checks much easier and cost affective. Looking ahead, at the March meeting we will be revisiting the assessment tool.
				If the delivery is appropriately labeled, are there repercussions to the third party delivering to underage recipients? Mary will check.
				After meeting note from Mary: As we talked about compliance checks for alcohol delivery, the question was asked what happens when 3 rd party delivery drivers deliver alcohol to minors since they are not LCB licensees. Here is the response from LCB enforcement: If they had knowledge of the alcohol being included in the sale, they could potentially be charged criminally for delivery to a minor based on the totality of the circumstances.
				As we discussed in the meeting, though, if they had no idea it was included (e.g., the outside of the package was not labeled as is required and they were not informed), then we would have a hard time proving it was done knowingly. However, the licensee would be in violation for not labeling the package.
