Prescription drug take-back helps prevent prescription misuse and accidental overdose.

- Medicines in the home are a leading cause of accidental poisoning.
- If you have stopped taking a prescription or it is expired, it is time to dispose.

Take-back programs protect the environment.

- Flushed or trashed medicines pollute waters and land.

Get in the habit of cleaning out your medicine cabinet. Dispose of all unused prescription medications using drug take-back:
