

10 PRINCIPLES OF NURTURING PARENTING

- 1. Human behavior is multi-dimensional: cognitive; affective and neurological.
- 2. Our Nature is influenced by positive and negative Nurture experiences.
- 3. Early childhood experiences literally become the building blocks for life.
- 4. Positive and negative life events carry both affective and cognitive cellular memories
- 5. Nurturing instruction is based on psycho-educational and cognitive-behavioral approaches to learning.
- 6. Nurturing Parenting embraces the theory of re-parenting.
- 7. Nurturing oneself as a man or woman is critical in becoming a nurturing father and mother.
- 8. There is a difference between our "being" (who we are) and our "doing" (roles and responsibilities)
- 9. Self-awareness and acceptance of past events in childhood are critical aspects of empowerment.
- 10. Adult learning is based on the assumptions of andragogy: adult's need to know, self-concept, experience, orientation to learning, readiness to learn and motivation to learn.

Based on the number of Parent Handbooks sold since 1985, over one million families have participated in the Nurturing Parenting Programs worldwide.

Dr. Bavolek is the principal author of the Nurturing Parenting Programs, the Adult-Adolescent Parenting Inventory (AAPI-2) and the Nurturing Skills Competency Scales (NSCS). He is also Executive Director of the Family Nurturing Centers, Inc. Born and raised in Chicago, he has spent his professional career spanning 40 years working with children and teens identified with a wide range of behavioral/emotional disorders, and families experiencing dysfunctional parent-child interactions, including child abuse and neglect.

Dr. Bavolek received his Ph.D. in 1978 from Utah State and developed the Adolescent Parenting Inventory as his doctoral dissertation. He completed a post-doctoral internship in 1978 at the Kempe Center in Denver Colorado working with abused children and abusive/neglecting parents. In 1983 he began work on the development and validation of the Nurturing Parenting Program through a grant from the National Institute of Mental Health while an Associate Professor at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. The Nurturing Parenting programs where first published in 1985 as the first validated, family-based parenting program targeted specifically for families experiencing child abuse and neglect. He has received numerous awards, conducted over 1,000 workshops, and authored parenting programs, DVDs and educational games.
