
CDC's Recommendations for Youth Prevention



- Increase price of tobacco products
- Secondhand smoke bans.
- Conduct mass media education campaigns
- Mobilize community to restrict minors' access to tobacco products
- Implement school-based programs as part of comprehensive strategy



10th Grade Youth Tobacco Rates










Policies Impact Quitline

School Based Interventions

- Curriculum
 - Shows short term impact
 - ROI documented
- Intervention Specialists
 - Groups/classes/ presentations
 - Refer to treatment
 - Maintain a prevention presence


- Policies

 - Signage increases compliance

- Total Public Housing Authorities






Good Policy - the gift that keeps giving
