### School Safety

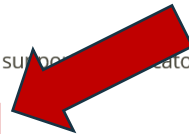
OSPI provides statewide leadership, guidance, training, and support for school safety educators. These pages contain information about a variety of school safety topics.

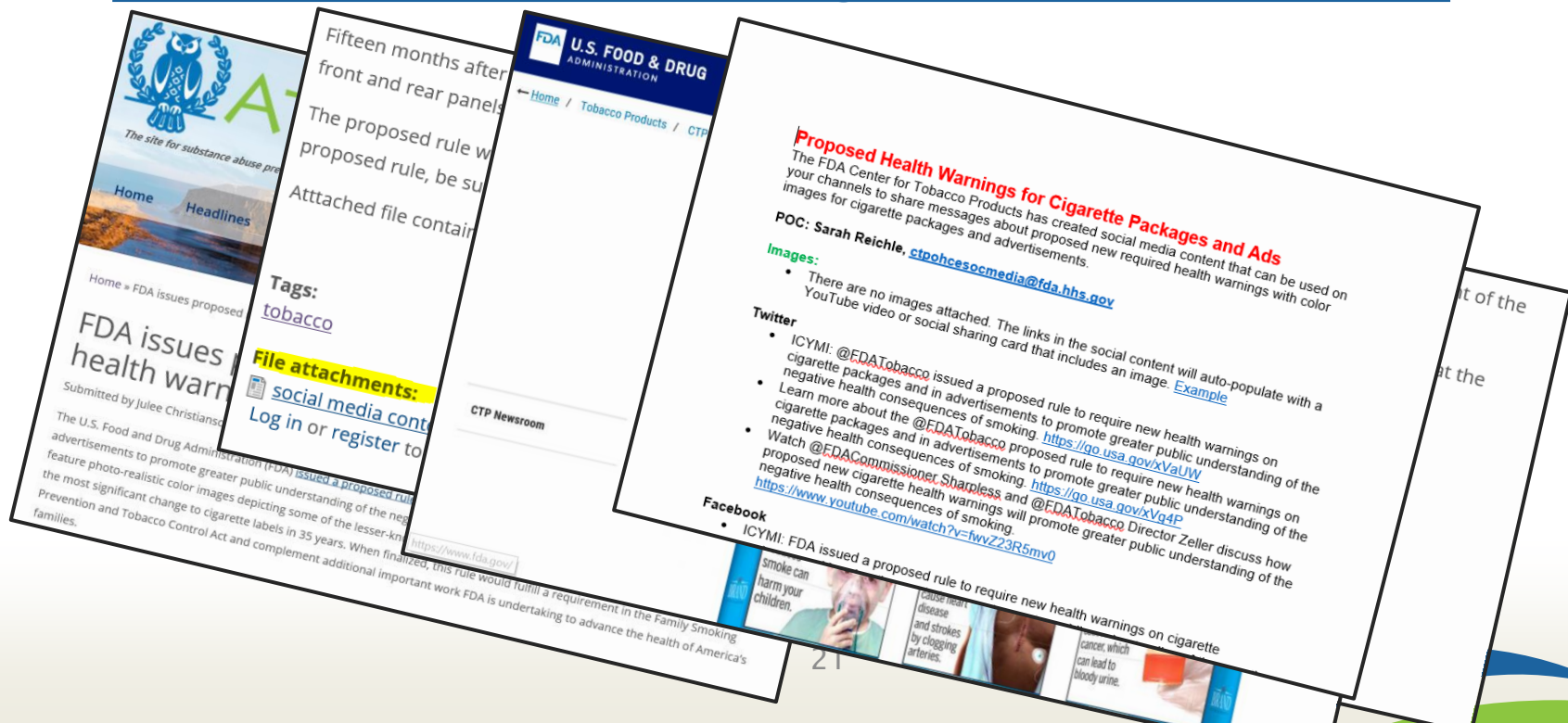


# Proposed New Cigarette Warnings

# Community Survey

# 2019 Community Survey timeline

- August 15 – December 15
  - Survey data collection by coalitions
- January – February 2020
  - Data Verification, coding, analysis
  - Report creation
- End of February / early March 2020
  - Reports & data to coalitions
- May – July 2020: Revision and Planning
  - Feedback from stakeholders

# Community Survey requirements

- 100-250 surveys per coalition – based on population of coalition community
  - Sample size for a diverse representative sample
  - Community population estimates and survey targets can be found on the Athena Forum

Total Population	Survey Targets
0 – 3,999	100 surveys
4,000 – 10,999	140 surveys
11,000 – 29,999	180 surveys
30,000 – 49,999	215 surveys
50,000 +	250 surveys

# Survey Administration

- Data Entry link
  - Use for entering data from paper surveys
  - Consult Data Entry manual for more details (found on Athena forum)
- Monitoring representativeness of community sample and alter strategies as needed
  - Strive for a representative sample of community members Missing key demographic/geographic groups limits utility of data
  - Review Data Book demographics page to identify target population
  - Revise strategy based on current tallies
    - Updates of counts and key demographics will be sent periodically. We aim for around the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> of each month

# Results links

- Survey Monkey results links
  - Though the survey is anonymous, individuals are potentially identifiable
  - As more responses are collected, the chance of identification is reduced
  - We will send the results link by request when at least 50 surveys are completed on a link
    - Spanish link is NOT distributed
