About Our Community

Compared to students in Washington State and Kittitas County, students in the Ellensburg School District (ESD) are more likely-typerience good family management, family rewards for prosocial involvement, parental attitudes unfavorable toward drug use, and academic success. However, they are also more likely to use tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs; experience depression, attemptusicide and incur death; skip school; fight, carry guns/weapons; and be arrested for alcohol and drug law violations.

About Prevention Programs in our Community

Coalition goals include improving the social skills of ESD students, reducing the low commitment to school, and improving community opportunities and rewards for prosocial involvement; reducing the availability of drugs in Ellensburg; and reducing the laws and norms in Ellensburg that are favorable to drug use. Coalition strategies are to:

- Teach **Second Step** (K-8) and **Positive Action** (9-12) in the Ellensburg School District: Promotes and encourages interpersonal cooperation, and provides a tool kit of options endorsing positive behavior
- Provide the opportunity to attend Curriculum Based Support
 Groups for mental health therapy
- Promote **Drug Take Back Day**Disposal of unused or expired Rx drugs twice per year
- Promote **Starts with One**: Educates about dangers of Rx drug misuse and importance of safe storage, use, and disposal
- Distribute **Medication Lock Boxes** For safe storage of Rx drugs for students and families in the community
- Advocate for an increase of 1/10 of 1% Sales Tax: To fund behavioral health services in Kittitas County

The Coalition will measure change in social competence/decision making skills, school connections, mentee quality of match, Rx drug disposal, Rx safe storage, and behavioral health workforce.
