## **About Our Community:**

Oak Harbor is located on the northern part of Whidbey Island, one of two islands that make up Island County. One bridge and two ferries provide the only access on/off the island. The first Europeans to settle in Oak Harbor were largely of Dutch heritage and many community members still identify with this ancestry. We are also home to Naval Air Station Whidbey Island—a large Naval installation which gives us a strong veteran population in addition to drawing a large, diverse population of young families from across the U.S and its territories. 35% of Oak Harbor School District students come from active duty families.
