4.			Jason	Jason provided a summary of the recently published article on young adult cannabis youth of which he was the primary author. Jason reviewed the background of the Young Adult Health Survey (young adults 18-25) and how the survey data was reviewed. He shared the data from the surveys which showed that young adult use of cannabis was significantly higher since legalization, primarily due to use by the 21-25 age group. Prevention needs to exist for the 18-25 youth.
