The youth groups created videos about their prevention projects. A video example was shown. The planning team is looking forward to 2022 Spring Youth Forum at Great Wolf Lodge.
	Alcohol Home Delivery Tool	9:30		Julia has been working with the alcohol action network to gather data with a compliance tool regarding home delivery observations regarding carding.
				Julia shared the Expanded Alcohol Availability tool and reviewed the purpose of the tool, the Observation Record Draft and an example of a completed record.
				The ask is that individuals from WHY might want to help with a beta test. It was noted that this is not compliance monitoring but is an observation process, and that the observation is to only be for normal alcohol purchases.
				There are two options concerning the data: users keep their own information, or could contribute the data to the alcohol action network's report.
3.			Julia Dilley	Timeline: The tool should be finalized by the next week or so and data is slated to be collected through November but may be cut off sooner. This tool will be used across several states. Washington's rulemaking is in motion right now; would it be better to collect information now (before rules) and later (after rules)?
				Members asked how many examples were needed, how many orders from that retailer? This is not a scientific random sample; it will be up to the community to ensure that the representation demonstrates the need of the community.
				Several additional questions were posted in the chat box.
				Sara suggested that a WHY ad hoc group be conviened to gather information. Stacey and Megan were interested in a beta test group; others are welcome to beta test as well.
