1	Welcome, introductions and Team Building	9:00	Mary Segawa WHY Co-Chair	Opening question: Tell us one upcoming highlight of your summer! Attendees introduced themselves and shared highlights of the upcoming summer.
2	Understanding youth and young adult data on underage drinking and marijuana use: Healthy Youth Survey (HYS), COVID Student Survey, (CSS), and Young Adult Health Survey (YAHS)	9:15	Jason Kilmer, Sandy Salivaras- Bodner	Mary introduced Jason and Sandy's work preparing and conducting surveys and then crunching the data. Sandy shared marijuana and alcohol data from the HYS. Healthy People 2030 has set a target of 5.8% for past 30 day marijuana use by 10 th graders. Sandy moved on to alcohol HYS data and explained the trends and things of which to be aware. Key take aways from her review were shared. Sandy will make the PPT available. Action: Communication Team needs to address the data point of 10 th graders getting alcohol with parental permission. Attendees were asked to consider what other

				sources, beside parents and siblings, might youth be getting alcohol from? And how we might be able to use STN as a platform for education on this topic. Jason began with the CSS. Jason gave a bit of history and the differences between HYS and CSS. The data will be shared with members. Members were given the opportunity to ask questions regarding the CSS data. Next Jason shared data gathered on the YAHS. It is not a random sample per se. Jason shared the data over eight cohorts regarding marijuana. Other data concerning other substances are decreasing; marijuana, however, is going up. Members asked, how does regular marijuana use compare with regular alcohol use? Jason shared 30% at least monthly cannabis use; alcohol 51% at least monthly. 50% respondants reported any use of both substances.
