Initial Concern

- Not enough input from our Latinx population
 - Community Survey
 - Attendance at meetings
 - Attempts to get strategies to Latinx community

Idea!

- Equity Focus Groups
 - Led by Claudia Avendano
 - Recruited mentors to lead the groups and come up with questions
 - Stipends offered to mentors
 - Mentors recruited participants AND incentives

Equity initiative focus group data

Date held: 2/28/2022

Language: Spanish

Modality: Zoom

- For confidentiality, each participant was assigned a number. 20 parents were invited and 18 were present.
- Participants were divided into two zoom rooms and were all asked the same questions

Questions Asked

- Question 1: Are you familiar with Coalitions and how they work?
- Question 2: Are you interested in participating with a coalition?
- Question 3: Name two reasons that prevent you from participating in coalitions
- Question 4: What would encourage you to attend? Name 2 reasons
- Question 5: What can we do to share information with the community and in an effective way about the coalition? Consider strategies.
- Question 6: What can we do to cultivate interest in participating with the coalition?
- Question 7: What are two topics of interest for you?

Things we found

- Many people were not familiar with coalitions until given an explanation
- 2) But then people WERE interested in being a part of coalitions great news!
- 3) The timing of our meetings was the biggest barrier
- 4) There is a lot of passion and enthusiasm in this community for our coalition topics

Next Steps

- Things currently in discussion:
 - A second meeting in Spanish at a more convenient time
 - Getting a stipend to pay a Spanish speaker to do some of the behind the scenes work of that second meeting
 - Making sure all of our materials are in both Spanish and English
 - Taking a close look at our action plan and budget for the next year
- Barriers:
 - Making sure everyone has a voice, not two coalitions
 - Language barrier AND professional barrier
