2.	Department of Health Agency Update	9:20	Heidi Glesmann	Heidi began by reviewing the mission, goals, and values the YCCTPP embraces. The division's objectives were reviewed. Heidi reviewed media buys, regional partners, new projects, organizational update. Attendees were invited to contact Heidi to get more information at heidi.glesmann@doh.wa.gov . Currently, the Tobacco and Cannabis Strategic plans are running concurrently. Is the epidemiologist position new or is it a vacant position being filled? Today is cut off. Fiscal committees are reviewing the bills that cost the state. The next cut off is next week. It is hard to choose priorities but S5365, Canned cocktail bill, Alcohol delivery, and Tobacco PUP bill.</p> <p>WASAVP: There were about 124 bills concerning all prevention areas introduced, 75 are still alive. SB5561, SB5357 (re: Blake decision), SB concerning telemedicine. Committees will be meeting to discuss these and other bills.</p> <p>CCSAP: Partners on college campuses are not supporting changing the alcohol blood level to .05 because of the current data.</p> <p>WTSC: supports the bill to get to the Target Zero goals. The commission is looking at how others are changing behaviors regarding drinking, cannabis, and driving.</p> <p>LCB: Reviewed the bills SB5375, HB1765, and HB1614</p> <p>Foundations for Healthy Generations: Interview last week on regulated substances and gaming would be interesting for members to review. Also, review the information about the Blake decision interview. Budgets are affected by the COVID dollars sunseting. It is important to watch the fiscal committees this next week.</p> <p>THC Fact Sheet: HCA finalized the longer two pager. Harrison joined to review the fact sheet. Be aware!</p> <p><i>...drinking a borg falls under the description “uncontrolled drinking”. He explained: “If you take a fifth of vodka, which is about 16 shots, and pour that into a half a gallon of water with some electrolytes, it doesn’t absolve the fact that you’re still drinking 16 shots of vodka.”</i></p> <p>David Jernigan from BU:</p> <p><i>David Jernigan, professor in the department of health law, policy and management at Boston University, added: “Making claims about these as a form of harm reduction for drinking have absolutely zero evidence of any basis. Keeping yourself hydrated is not going to meaningfully reduce the risks.”</i></p> <p>https://news.yahoo.com/borg-why-college-parents-know-174408393.html</p> <p>Sara: SAP funding is being looked at with the results of that work. Looking to expand that work.</p> <p>Penny: A fact sheet will be shared. In the next few months WTSC will be creating contracts with communities. The commission is data driven – a report from the WA Asso Sheriffs/Pol Chiefs – data regarding DUI incidents for the last years. The data is significant concerning the involvement of youth.</p>
