- Pregnant and Parenting WG update: Data not supporting as large of a need for this workgroup. There are other groups focused on this population outside of SPE. Removing as an active workgroup.
 - Opioid Prevention Workgroup
 - Notes: Changed name from “Rx Abuse Px Workgroup” to use less stigmatizing name. Meetings will be picking up in July as folks have been busy with COVID-19. Agency applying for State Opioid Response grant (includes focus on stimulants). 2020 Region 10 Opioid Summit postponed to 2021 due to COVID. With Take Back events cancelled, adding additional promotion around drop off locations and mail-in prescription return.
 - WHY Coalition
 - Notes: Meeting on 4/17. Moved next meeting to 5/29 so folks who are attending the College all-day workshop on 5/15. Celebrated successes. Focused on COVID impacts on alcohol and marijuana use, using research from other similar disasters to understand best approach. Start Talking Now is thriving as a resource – particularly around promoting conversations with youth in current climate.

- Notes: *Alcohol, cannabis, and poly drug use as contributors to motor vehicle fatalities/ injuries.* Trends in drivers involved in fatal crashes positive for alcohol or drugs – or both! Increase of drivers involved in fatal crashes testing positive for poly-drugs. Beyond alcohol and marijuana, amphetamines are most frequently found in these drugged driving reports. SEE ATTACHED PDF
