- Survey period: March 8-26, 2021.
- 330 schools opted in (35 of 39 counties), over 35,000 participants
- Schools received their results in the Spring.

- Opioid Prevention Workgroup (highlighted) Alicia, Erika
 - o Group feeds into the State Prevention Enhancement Consortium (SPE) & State Opioid Workgroup.
 - See PowerPoint for strategies, related accomplishments, what's coming up, and a list of partners.
 Next meeting is November 16. Meetings are 3rd Tuesday every other month, from 3-4 p.m.
- Young Adults Cannabis Prevention Workgroup Gitanjali
 - The group is reaching out...
 - To other research and prevention groups to find where they overlap.
 - About the possibility of offering this as a capstone/student project.
 - With questions about how project fits with other research in state.
 - Recruiting members, discussing how to incorporate young adult voices, ensuring the work is representative of young adults in the state.
- WHY Coalition Isaac W. filling in
 - Focused on underage alcohol and marijuana use.
 - Manages the Start Talking Now resource page and campaign.
 - Recently published a guide on Delta 8 THC for public health providers.
 - Looking for a co-chair to fill the vacancy left by Sara Cooley-Broschart from LCB.
 - Next meeting is September 17. Meetings are the 3rd Friday every month from 9-12.
- Mental Health Workgroup Jen
 - Continuing work on suicide prevention, intervention, post-vention resources in communities.
 - o Working on a 1-pager of resources to provide to communities.
 - Next steps:
 - Build out list of resources specific to cultural groups.
 - Post-vention guidance doc for communities and prevention managers in communities.
 - Update Mental Health Suicide Prevention page on Athena.
 - O DOH/DBHR leaders met on how to better collaborate with other agencies (including many new groups started due to Covid) to streamline the work and avoid duplication of efforts.
 - Suicide prevention month. Cross-suicide media group put together a toolkit (includes tribal information) re: what to do if self or others are experiencing suicidal ideation. Trying to reduce the stigma of talking to others.
 - o Trauma informed preventions webinar for prevention providers is tomorrow (September 14).
- Tobacco and Vapor Products Workgroup Patti, Ray
 - Work on establishing a statewide Commercial Tobacco Coalition continues.
 - Decisions pending, so November launch may be postponed.
 - May transition planning group into a founding/steering committee of sorts, then launch larger coalition next March/April.
 - Establishing a functioning steering committee now will help ensure this group will have a voice during the legislative session.
 - Timelines may be clarified by the end of September.
 - Monthly Policy Learning Circles will move to every two weeks November though Leg Session.
 - Accepted to present session at the WSPHA Conference [Washington State Public Health Association] on Oct 18.
 - Panel discussion entitled: "A New Partnership to Combat an Old Enemy."

- o Competitive application awarded to WA to host the 23rd "SAMHSA Center of Excellence State Leadership Academy of Wellness and Tobacco Free Recovery," April 19-20, 2022.
 - Supports 40 participants for the meeting and follow-up.
 - This relates to the work of the Tobacco Cessation Interagency workgroup, a subcommittee of the SPE
 Tobacco & Vapor Products Issues Workgroup and is staffed by Nick Fradkin.
 - A small team at DOH attended a recent national event and heard how the event can lead to positive results by melding behavioral health with that tobacco cessation program and building partnerships with sister agencies.
