# Share highlights from your group discussion

Go to the community and don't wait for them to come to you.

Take care of yourself so you can sustainably help others.

Follow up with old members (inactive since COVID) and let them know you've missed them at meetings!

Offer to share SAP outcomes data at collation meetings or with principals

# Share highlights from your group discussion

Create diverse relationships with aligned missions for unique impact

Give each person a place of belonging and power

Analyze who isn't at the table and reach out to them or find a key leader for the group or agency

Knowing your community Finding the means and ways to navigate within the new post COVID Normal

Intentionally seeking out people who are missing from table and inviting them to join

Really listen to what 'I' can do for others to not only receive but truly give to the needs of our community partners.

Remember "Today is a new day for a new beginning"

Meet with local SRO's and drug task force group (enforcement)

Communication, networking, Coalition event to bring in old and new members.
