Sabrina was able to provide technical assistance to the Substance Abuse Prevention Systems Training (SAPST) as well as complete over 150 hours of continuing education classes. She was also involved in research done around the relationship of opioid use within student athletes, the redesign of new fellows' orientation, and a project highlighting media that supports positive social norms. During her phase 2, Sabrina assisted in a Starts with One Campaign throughout the Marysville School District. In Phase 3, Sabrina presented at the regional Family Youth and System Partner Round Table (FYSPRT), focusing on the importance of prevention science.
