
Budget Overview

SUD Funding**






- ▶ Advisory Workgroup – suggested late Spring, but this will not work because...



Budgets as part of the policy process

- ▶ 2024 is a supplemental budget year
 - ▶ *Typically* no major changes to biennial budget (policy-level changes)
- ▶ Revenue forecasts influence available funds
 - ▶ February forecast showed slightly increased revenue projections (0.2%) from November*
- ▶ Budgets are central to the policy process
 - ▶ 3 types of budgets
 - ▶ **Operating**, capital, transportation
 - ▶ House and Senate budgets are here!
 - ➔ Conference budget comes next

DUI

▶ ESHB 1493 – Impaired driving:

- ▶ Changes the “lookback period,” or period for reviewing prior convictions to determine whether the current offense is a felony, from 10 to 15 years.
- ▶ Creates a new impaired driving drug offender sentencing alternative (DOSA) for individuals convicted of felony impaired driving offenses.
- ▶ Permits a person to participate in a second deferred prosecution if they participate in a deferred prosecution for their first gross misdemeanor DUI/physical control of a vehicle under the influence (PC) charge.
- ▶ Establishes an effective date of January 1, 2026.
- ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**



Alcohol and Cannabis

- ▶ **HB 2260** - Alcohol sale to minors penalties:
 - ▶ Establishes civil penalties and monetary fines for the unlawful sale or supply of alcohol to minors
 - ▶ Companion bill: SB 6201 (dead)
 - ▶ *LCB request legislation*
 - ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**

Addressing risks of high THC products

- ▶ **Problem:** High concentration THC products pose a higher risk to consumers, especially youth and young adults (higher SUD rates, physical effects, and link to SMI).
 - ▶ Market share of cannabis concentrates has nearly quadrupled since retail stores opened
 - ▶ Disproportionate use of high THC among those who report being Latino, low income, or having poor mental health

- ▶ **2SHB 2320:** Concerning High THC Cannabis Products
 - ▶ DOH to develop
 - 1) optional health and safety training for retail staff and
 - 2) point of sale health information
 - 3) public health information campaign aimed at vulnerable populations
 - ▶ UW ADAI to develop and implement guidance and health recommendations for providers and at-risk patients
 - ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**


Cannabis

▶ **SHB 1453-** Medical Cannabis Tax Exemption:

- ▶ Provides a tax exemption from the 37 percent cannabis excise tax for qualifying purchases:
 - 1) Patients and designated providers with a recognition card
 - 2) Products that are labeled as Department of Health (DOH) compliant product and tested in accordance with the DOH's rules.
 - 3) Cannabis retail store with medical endorsement
- ▶ Senate version (striker) adds expiration data and tax evaluation requirement
- ▶ **Status: House Speaker Signed**

▶ **SHB 1249-** Retail Cannabis Products:

- ▶ Increases the limit for the sale/gifting of low THC beverages (<4mg) from 72oz to:
 - Sale: 200mg THC limit (50+ individual packaged units, depending on unit content)
 - Gift: 100mg THC limit (25+ individual packaged units)
- ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**



Cannabis

▶ **ESB 5363-** Allowances for Cannabis Advertising


1. Defines trade name signs. Trade name signs only reflect name of business
2. Increases the number of allowed ads from 2-4. Adds exceptions and restrictions for these signs.
3. LCB retains authority to regulate cannabis ads; trade name signs are regulated by localities. Localities enforce trade name signs and the size/number of billboards
4. Loosens content restrictions for indoor (point of sale) advertisements

▶ **Status: House Rules**



Schools and Early Intervention

- ▶ **E2SHB 1956-** Substance use prevention education:
 - ▶ Directs the Department of Health to develop, implement, and maintain a statewide drug overdose prevention and awareness campaign to address the drug overdose epidemic through 2029
 - ▶ Directs OSPI to develop classroom materials in alignment with DOH's public awareness campaign by December 2025
 - ▶ Requires OSPI to adjust the state health and physical education learning standards for middle and high school students to add opioids
 - ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**



Opioids

- ▶ **SSB 5906-** Drug overdose prevention:
 1. DOH must develop and implement a statewide prevention education campaign
 2. Must include methamphetamine, opioids, and drug use.
 3. Focus on youth and adults
 4. Include feasibility study for creation of overdose prevention hotline.
- ▶ **Status: House Rules**



Opioids

- ▶ **SHB 2112-** Higher Ed. opioid prevention:
 - ▶ Each public and private institution of higher education shall provide opioid and fentanyl prevention education and awareness information to all students. Must include Good Samaritan statute.
 - ▶ Naloxone and fentanyl strips must be made available to students on campus.
 - ▶ Staff working in residence halls must be trained on how to administer naloxone. Must include standing order language. Includes null and void language.
 - ▶ **Status: Senate Rules**
