
2025-2027 Proposed Budget


Session Overview

The 2025 legislative session is 105 days and ends April 27th


The legislature cycle is two years long. In that two-year cycle there is a regular session held each year. In the odd-numbered years regular session is 105 days. In the even year it is 60 days.

- January 13: 1st day of session
- February 21st: Policy committee cutoff (Day 40)
- **February 28th:** Fiscal Committee cutoff (Day 47)
- Solution March 12th: House of Origin Cutoff (Day 59)

Cross over (process repeats)

- April 2nd: Policy committee cutoff (Day 80)
- April 8th: Fiscal committee cutoff (Day 86)
- April 16th: Opposite House Cutoff (Day 94) Last day to consider bills UNLESS Necessary to Implement the budget (NTIB)



Key Terms/Concepts

- Companion Bill- introduced in the opposite house that has similar language
 - Effect: Expedites and improves likelihood of passage
- Agency Request Bill- request for legislation proposed by an agency of the executive branch
 - Effect: Has executive support, increasing likelihood of passage
- Regulatory Authority- the scope of an agencies ability to regulate a given issue
 - Example: The bill legalizing retail cannabis gave regulatory authority of retail oversight to the Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB)
- RCW- (Revised Code of Washington)- a codification of current statutes

Strategic planning is a core component of effective prevention efforts. Strategic planning makes the difference between trying to help and using a data-informed approach to ensure we are making a lasting difference in the health of our youth and communities while also guiding the use of limited resources. In Washington state, we have adapted the <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services</u> Administration's (SAMHSA) Strategic Prevention Framework (SPE) to inform community planning.

To assist you in your planning efforts, we put together this page of resources to help you when and how you need them. Some of these resources are specific to the Community Prevention and Wellness Initiative (CPWI) and designed by Health Care Authority's (HCA) Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR) staff and partners, while other resources are from SAMHSA, <u>Community Anti-Drug</u> <u>Coalitions of America (CADCA)</u>, or other experts in community and <u>program</u> and prevention science. This information can be used by any coalition or group hoping to go upstream and prevent substance use disorder, promote mental health, and reduce related behavioral health challenges.

Nicole Roach – Okanogan County Community Coalition

- Nicole has taken advantage of the Communities Talks stiped so Martha Williams, prevention manager, asked her a few questions!
- How hard was it to get a participation invitation from info@stopalcoholabuse.net?
 - Very easy! All I did was email the above address and request an invitation to apply. They replied within a few days, asking for some basic information to ensure I qualified. I sent that in, and they replied, saying they would send me a link with the invitation within one to two weeks.
- Were there "hoops" to jump through to get the \$750 stipend check from SAMHSA?
 - None! The application process was very quick and easy. I don't recall having any issues. Upon completing the application, I was told that a check would be mailed out shortly. And it was! I believe the time between request for invitation, and a check being mailed to me, was less than a month.



Continued

• What did you use the stipend for?

- We used the stipend towards the purchasing of "Screenagers", which we played at our Key Leader meeting. There were some limitations around what you could use the stipend for, but I don't remember them specifically. I know that you couldn't use it for food.
- Was there a requirement of information to provide to SAMHSA after the event?
 - Afterwards, you can go back in and update how you used the money. There was no required reporting, sending in receipts, etc., though.



Evidence-Informed

- Participatory Research
- Focus groups and interviews
- Meta-analysis
- Pre/post with control group

Engagement-Informed

- Retention, completion high and matches served demographics
- Testimonials and photovoice
- Pre/Post (No control group)

Theory-Informed

- Conceptual design, theory of change, and/or logic model align
- Vetted by members of culture or community

Evaluation Evidence

Evidence-Based (EBP)

- Randomized controlled trial or two quasi-experimental trials
- Effects relevant to funding source priorities

Research-Based (RBP)

- Has research/eval evidence but does not reach EBP
- Applies to Cannabis, Tribal, MHPP

Promising Program

- Strong theory of change, design
- Might be EBP for other priority (e.g., mental health) but not tested for this one (e.g., cannabis)

- Is the MHPP RFA delayed due to budget freeze?
 - Yes, see the slide regarding the CBO FOA.
- Is the \$10k that was to be allocated to CPWI Coalitions impacted by the budget freeze?

Do we know what the strategies look like SB 5273?

The bill defines violence prevention interventions including: "Facilitating behavior change, providing socialemotional support, peer support and peer counseling, mentorship, conflict mediation and crisis intervention, care coordination, targeted case management, referrals to credentialed health care providers or social services providers, community and school support services, patient education and screening services, group and individual health education and health coaching, health navigation, transitions of care support, and screening and assessment for nonclinical and social needs."
