Evidence-based programs must have direct or indirect links to opioid use outcomes² based on at least one Randomized Controlled Trial or two Quasi-Experimental Design studies and be rated:

- Blueprints rating of Promising OR
- WSIPP rating of Evidence-based or Research-based OR
- CrimeSolutions rating of Effective OR
- CEBC rating of 1 Well Supported or 2 Supported OR
- Title IV-E rating of Well-Supported OR
- WWC rating of Strong, Moderate, or Promising OR
- CASEL rating of SELect
