


- ▶ Best when limited to smaller amounts.





▶ PFS Year 2 spending was...



Management Information System Transition

Background

We're transitioning where school-based services are reported.

- ▶ **Minerva:** An online reporting system that CPWI contractors (coalitions, tribes, CBO's) use to report monthly activities, pre/post test results, and more.
- ▶ **LGAN:** Looking Glass Analytics; an online reporting system designed specifically for school-based services, where SAP contractors report monthly activities and store caseload records.

Next school year, we're integrating school-based services into Minerva, and we will no longer report activities in LGAN.


Vision

- ▶ Single system for reporting prevention and promotion services.
- ▶ Make reports available at local level for full scope of CPWI.
- ▶ Reports help inform local services.

To best serve the people of Washington, we will create a single system for reporting services that enables us to maximize resources, integrates our service delivery data entry and reporting and provides information to help inform local services at state and local level.

Goals

- ▶ Continue to meet **state and federal** reporting obligations.
- ▶ Reduce **administrative burden** for reporting by providers.
- ▶ Reduce **administrative management** by state.
- ▶ Avoid **service disruption** and provide training / technical assistance throughout the process.
- ▶ Ensure ESDs are **engaged** and inform the process.

Question	Answer
Are ESSB 5984 and ESHB 2225 targeted at students or the public in general?	ESSB 5984 and ESHB 2225 relate to general public but there is language specific to minors in the bill. You can read more here: https://app.leg.wa.gov/billsummary/?BillNumber=2225&Year=2025&Initiative=false

Budget Updates

Question	Answer
Are we anticipating changes to our funding?	
For budget planning purposes, what do you recommend we plan for? \$145,000 again for CPWI?	Yes! For SFY 2027 CPWI budgets, please continue to plan for \$145k per Coalition.

Statewide Updates

Question	Answer
Is there a way to give communities a heads up for the planning process while you are creating the A&R's?	We are working on allocations now with the goal of (at minimum) having proposed fund sources / amounts for you in March.
I have concerns about the funding we receive July1-Sept 30. 20k or 17k is not enough to cover wages and benefits, this makes it impossible to have summer programming. We originally asked for additional funds for our newly developing mentoring program. If we are awarded the additional funding, can we use it for salary and programs?	We have made note of that for consideration as we navigate allocations! Yes, with permission from your managers.

Statewide Updates

Question	Answer
Does this align with our assessment timeline?	Yes! Data Books in August / September and then yes, you'd be reviewing data along the same time period but given this is an "update" I'd expect the process to be much quicker than last go around for example.
Has there been any discussion on making changes to our fiscal year so that the funding is balances throughout the entire year? Would aligning our budget cycle with federal awards alleviate the feast and famine?	We have discussed that, and at one time (cohort 5-6) allocated on FFY but that presented other challenges that were more problematic. As needed, we can allocate more funding July - Sept to balance out to that total \$145k. Most providers find the \$20k to be enough but we definitely understand it's not a one size fits all :)
Did you say the window for SYF applications will be 2-3 weeks? Do you know when they will be announced?	Yes! Mid-March is our estimate.

Workforce Development

Question	Answer
Will October 27th be the required meeting for the Prevention Summit?	The first day (Provider Meeting) and the two days of the conference are required for CPWI coordinators and then yes day 1 (or 0 depending on how you look at it) is required for ESD reps.
Are there rooms blocked at the Murano?	Yes, we will be working on a room block with them!
2-3 weeks time is not enough to get an overnight field trip approved for students in my school district. Most school district meet only once or twice a month and overnight field trips must be approved by the school board. We will not be able to send our prevention students to SYF. 2 months notice is the standard.	We have been experiencing a contract / budget freeze and navigating a new vendor. I am sorry they will not be able to attend. We continue to do everything in our power to navigate this new landscape as quickly as possible.
Any word on Coalition Leadership Institute - hours and location?	Check the Training Plan on Athena! We have the tentative dates and the location is still in the works but still looking to be local to the Olympia area.
