Goals for the first PRI Community Survey

Provide data for understanding social norms


- What do adults believe about youth substance use?
 - What are the biggest problems?
 - What is the role and effectiveness of law enforcement?
- What are adult perceptions of the community's norms?

Collect baseline data for environmental strategies that target adult attitudes.

- Social marketing
 - "Counter" advertising or other targeted communication strategies
 - Social Norms Marketing
- Law enforcement effectiveness, awareness, public support, etc.




Sample Size





Respondent Gender





Racial and Ethnic Diversity

- White/Caucasian respondents account for over 75% of the sample.
- Seven sites had a significant number (10%+) of Hispanic respondents.
- Most of the Native
 Americans surveyed were in two sites.
- Only one site has a significant number of African American respondents.









Respondent Age and Education





Perception by Socio-economic Status

Among the youth in your community, how much of a problem are these issues?






Cross-site Comparison:

Underage drinking and teen marijuana use are the top rated issues in most communities




Among the youth in this community, how much of a problem are these issues:



NOTES: Scores range from 1 (not a problem) to 4 (a serious problem).




Cross-site Comparison: Community Norms (1)






Cross-site Comparison: Community Norms (2)






Cross-site Comparison: Law Enforcement

Lessons Learned

Frustration about some of the answer options

- Allow mulitple selection
 - Pros and cons...
 - Re-work the answer options
- Allow "don't know"---or explain better

Find a way to allow contact information!

- The versions were inconsistent on this point---and the people who used the on-line version that did allow personal info---no complaints?
 - Solutions?
 - An extra tear-off page
 - Online: automatically send to a new webpage

Lessons Learned, continued

Many PRI sites wanted to add questions, and quite a few did: three approaches...

- Do the paper-and-pencil survey, then just enter data from statewide survey portion
- Subscribe to Survey Monkey (or gizmo) and do a local survey that includes statewide survey

Missing content areas---consider revisions so as to reduce the need for "add ons".
