





HOME VISITING SERVICES ACCOUNT

- Created in the 2010 legislative session
- Matches and leverages public and private funds
- Washington State Department of Early Learning (DEL) oversees the HVSA
- Thrive Washington administers programs funded through the HVSA



Home Visiting Is ...

- Long-term, in-home visits with trained professional that are
 - o Voluntary
 - Have an emphasis on birth to 3
 - Can follow one of many models or programs



HOME VISITING OUTCOMES

- Maternal and child health
- Child abuse and neglect, and injury prevention
- Reduction of domestic violence
- Coordination of community resources and supports
- Child development and parenting
- Economic self-sufficiency



Nurse-Family Partnership


• Prenatal to age 2

- First-time moms only
- Voluntary
- Weekly/bi-weekly visits
- Focus on health outcomes
- Administered by nurses
- •\$4,000-\$7,500


Parent-Child Home Program


- •16 months to age 4
- Low-income families
- Voluntary
- •Two years
- Twice-a-week visits
- Focus on literacy
- Administered by community leaders
- •\$2,500-\$4,900


