Washington Traffic Safety Commission Agency Update	9:20	Wade Alonzo and Edica Esqueda, WTSC	Edica introduced herself and the programs she manages and the practices that are related to those programs. The PPT regarding the WTSC will be sent out to members after the meeting. The commission is going through Strategic Planning; she reviewed the Mission and Vision as well as some data regarding crashes and other traffic
				safety. There has been a significant increase in traffic deaths. Traffic Safety Commission is a

				commission required by the feds and all states have different iterations of the commission. WTSC has a staff of about 25. Edica shared the organizational chart. Currently WTSC is recruiting for program staff. Funding was reviewed focusing on the behavioral health programs. Core programs and priorities were reviewed. The commission focuses on positive behaviors (social norms) rather than negative behaviors. The WTSC has a dashboard ( <a href="https://wtsc.wa.gov/research-data/dashboards/">https://wtsc.wa.gov/research-data/dashboards/</a> ) where the data on local crashes can be pulled out for use.
