2.	OSPI Agency Update	9:20	Anna Marie DuFault – OSPI Assistant Superintendent	Anna Marie provided a deeper dive of her background. She shared OSPI's mission which dovetails with WHY's goals. Anne Marie shared some of the ongoing projects she will be maintaining and some of the newer projects that are happening around the state. COVID has severely impacted the students in our state; schools and school districts have been grappling with how to keep students safe. In	

				addition, there has been an increase in students vaping that has negatively impacted students. OSPI is looking at bringing back the type of program that was used with the original tobacco program to combat this. OSPI is also working to support the schools with this program and is looking to increase the number of Student Assistance Professionals and other key behavioral health staff in the schools. Anne Marie is looking at how OSPI can assist with the CPWI/SAP work. Another opportunity is underpinning students' learning standards by using social emotional learning. Project AWARE and other applications for funding opportunities are being planned. Members participated in a discussion about student discipline, budget cuts, and how those items cause staff and students to go into survival mode. The agency is also looking at getting back to the needs of the students and staff using the public health model.
