Liz provided information about the capacity building grants. Eleven grantees will hopefully start their contract October 1, 2023. The funding priorities were reviewed, as well as policy, systems and environmental change and the related strategies. The mentoring facet the grant entailed and the mentoring objectives were explained. Heidi shared the project timeline. <b>Kasey Kates</b> provided a short update on DBHR's recent request for Application (RFA); the awardees have been confirmed. Funding includes two year Dedicated Cannabis Account (DCA) (six awardees), one year DCA (five awardees), and two year MHPP (10 awardees). Conversations are occurring concerning Opioid funding opportunities going forward.
