### **Pharmacy Point of Sale project**

The Health Care Authority is beginning its journey of modularizing its Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) with the replacement of the first module – the Pharmacy Point of Sale system. The replacement project will replace the current system with a new solution to offer the latest functionality, features, and technology.

In addition to the current system functions that receive and adjudicate claims, managed care organization encounters and process drug rebate invoicing, the future solution will include cloud-hosted architecture that is flexible and scalable to meet future needs. Additional features will include a secure web portal for drug labelers to retrieve quarterly invoices and claim level data and a more robust prior authorization workflow.

The current projected go-live date is Sunday, March 26, 2023.

There will be minor changes for pharmacies, including the BIN/PCN and Group they bill for Apple Health (Medicaid) FFS pharmacy claims. New numbers will be provided as the go-live date gets closer. Pharmacies will be encouraged to get all reversals submitted before the go-live date to streamline these changes.

HCA will be engaging in Consultation to ensure this system serves the Washington Tribes, and a Dear Tribal Leader Letter will be sent out soon with more detailed information.

# Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Workgroup Members Needed

The Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) is seeking workgroup members to advise on Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (IECMHC) programs for Tribal communities. IECMHC is an intervention that teams a mental health professional with early care and education staff and families to help promote the social and emotional development of the young children in their care.

DCYF received \$260,000 to support IECMHC in tribal child care and early learning programs. Workgroup members will advise DCYF on the best way to use these funds. We seek the voices of any Tribal member or representative with interest or experience in mental health. This includes but is not limited to: Tribal leaders, Tribal Mental Health providers, Behavioral Health staff, Head Start/Early Head Start Education Directors, ECEAP/Early ECEAP Education Directors.

# Apple Health Enrollees Monthly Internet Discount

A monthly internet service discount and a one-time connected device benefit from participating internet companies is available through the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP), a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program. ACP is not administered by the Health Care Authority (HCA), and eligible reimbursements are made directly between the ACP and providers.

- Up to a \$75/month discount on gualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time device discount of up to \$100

One monthly service discount and one device discount is allowed per household.
