






EBP Selection and Ratios





2019-2021:

National registry (NREPP) discontinued



- WSU IMPACT lab created tools and reviewed evidence for existing EIP programs
- Community providers provided feedback on EBP list processes

> 2021-2023:

- Community feedback reviewed
- WSU updated tools to address gaps in evidence
- DBHR integrated community feedback and WSU tools to establish consistent, stable process
- Process piloted in update of outcome-specific lists (Cannabis, Opioid, Mental Health)
- Re-review of EIP with updated tools and steps




