## **OSPI LifeSkills Grant Opportunity**

### Purpose:

Support implementation of LifeSkills Training Middle School Curriculum in school setting or community-based organization (after-school like Boys & Girls Club)

### Program:

Evidence-based program that helps students:

- enhance their self-esteem
- develop problem-solving abilities
- reduce stress and anxiety
- manage anger
- overcome shyness
- communicate clearly
- build relationships
- $\circ~$  avoid violence and
- Develop refusal skills to prevent and reduce the use of marijuana

Level One (15 Sessions), Level Two (10 Sessions), and Level Three (5 Sessions) Typically delivered to 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders over the course of 3 years.

## GOAL

To assess attitudes, beliefs, and practices related to youth substance use and behavioral health of adults in your community.

### PURPOSE

- Assessment where are we at?
  - Contribute to the development of coalition strategic plans
- Monitoring & trends what has changed?
  - Evaluation
  - Contribute to <u>biennial strategic plan updates</u>
  - Early indicator of change
- To develop <u>a statewide</u> convenience sample <u>profile</u>
  - Inform planning, campaigns, outreach

## **Community Survey**

- Survey respondent counts will be sent in starting in October
  - 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> goals to send out in October and November. Weekly updates in December.
