What is a Tobacco Treatment Specialist (TTS)?

A Tobacco Treatment Specialist is a professional who possesses the skills, knowledge and training to provide effective, evidence-based interventions for tobacco dependence across a range of intensities. A TTS may engage not only in providing treatment but also in educating others (healthcare professionals, administrators, scientists, smokers, nonsmokers) about tobacco dependence treatments.

Did you know that addressing smoking during treatment for other substance use is associated with a 25% increase in long-term abstinence?

This training will equip healthcare providers of all types, from addiction counselors to social workers, to integrate tobacco dependence treatment into their current practices.

Successful completion of this 4-day accredited program makes you eligible to apply for the National Certificate in Tobacco Treatment Practice through NAADAC.
