Young Adults Cannabis 7-12-2021.p

- Poor outcomes in young adult cannabis users include cognitive impairment, not graduating, and more.
- Data compared State Prevention Enhancement outcome measures shows all trends going in the wrong direction.
- Young adult perspectives were gathered through conversations, media, and environmental factors.
- Most communication is to a younger audience and messages are purely prevention focused.
- Research is lacking on cannabis use in young adults, but we know messages should include physical harm avoidance and harm reduction tools.
- The Workgroup is trying to understand protective factors to reduce harm, understand misperceptions, and learn how to provide the knowledge needed for effective prevention messaging, programming, and services.

Q&A / Discussion

- Discussed messaging strategies for college buses that promote/transport to dispensaries.
- The Outcome Evaluation report that comes out Sept 2022 targets youth (under 21) and adults (over 21) rather than specifically targeting young adults, based on legal age.
- Workgroup is now considering youth as up to age 25.
