Opioid Prevention Workgroup	<ul> <li>Updates to the State Opioid Response Plan are in process – near the end of the design phase. Adding language around health equity and justice statements.         <ul> <li>Discussion around including stimulants in language. Our workgroup did not make those changes this go around, but open for discussion. Reminded them that there is also the SPE Consortium and would not want to focus to become "all drug prevention" because that is handled w/in other workgroups.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Discussed representation of Prevention on the steering committee for the Roadmap to Recovery project – more to come from Kris</li> <li>Starts with One Pharmacy Campaign results shared – looking to expand into next year. Slide deck from campaign results available on request.</li> <li>Brainstormed on activities for Take Back Day (virtually): included promoting Take Back Your Meds; Starts with One campaign; Tribal Campaign collaboration; and promoting drive-through drop box locations</li> <li>Large discussion on health equity – what gaps are the agency representatives seeing, how can the workgroup address those gaps. Solutions presented: increasing representation on boards and commissions on various health professions; having a dissemination strategy with talking points, common language, etc.; and hosting the DBHR Opioid Roundtable to discuss the opioid crisis and how it is impacting high-need communities in WA State.</li> </ul>		
Washington Healthy Youth (WHY) Coalition	<ul> <li>WHY has continued to meet this summer and have focused much of our conversation on monitoring the additional allowances for liquor and cannabis business during COVID and starting to think about preparing for legislative session.</li> <li>The Communications team is interested in updating the Start Talking Now website. This website is a resource for parents, caregivers, and other trusted adults. An update would increase accessibility and expand to cover social-emotional issues and other developmentally appropriate</li> </ul>		

Mental Health Workgroup	topics (driver safety, etc.). Currently investigating costs and resources and developing a proposal.  The Communications team continues to be an advisory board for alcohol and marijuana prevention campaigns developed by HCA and DOH, as well as regularly updates the Start Talking Now website and Facebook page.  Working on updating our Parent Guide. Obtained group consensus to review goals, progress and develop sub workgroups surrounding the goals to develop action plans.  Developed a sub group who will be working on identify measurements of mental health other than the absence of disorders. The group will be looking at research and what others have used to measure wellness to help us identify other points of data we can collect to inform our efforts.  Another subgroup created to work on developing a funding strategy to utilize current resources and identify opportunities for funding.  Completion of the first year for our MHPP community based organization grants.  Next steps is to develop a sub group that will work on develop a toolkit of the different resources available to communities for prevention, intervention and post-intervention to reduce the potential for youth suicide and mental health

Christine is a Prevention Policy and Project Manager at DBHR, and Gitanjali is a postdoctoral research associate in the IMPACT Research Lab.</li> <li>Young adult's access to marijuana through retail stores has risen from 9% in 2014 to 78% in 2019.</li> <li>The workgroup is currently in the re- planning phase and recruiting members.
