STR-CPWI Program and Strategy Selection Guidance

The programs and strategies in **Table A**, are the approved preliminary Evidence-based Programs (EBPs) for the State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis - Community Prevention and Wellness Initiative (STR-CPWI) Community Coalitions to use in the 2017 Strategic Planning process.

- Programs in **Table A** are the only programs that will count toward meeting the 60% EBP program requirement.
 - All other programs and strategies shall be counted as innovative and may not exceed
 40% of the planned number of programs per year.
 - If a direct service program or strategy is listed on the Excellence in Prevention list on www.theAthenaForum.org/learning_library/ebp that program/strategy is still considered innovative if it is not listed in Table A.
- The Environmental and Information Dissemination Strategies are neutral and will not count toward or against the 60% EBP requirement.
 - The Environmental and Information Dissemination strategies listed in Table B are the Environmental and Information Dissemination strategies that have been identified for the focus of the STR-CPWI funds.
